Address Documenting Instructional Needs Here: ECA provides each student and family with an Individual Graduation Plan. The staff then looks at these plans each semester to ensure we are following these plans so each student stays on track for graduation.

**Student Social Emotional Learning and Mental Health Needs:** Provide additional student support service personnel, specifically 2 student social work interns and a youth advocate, to be placed at ECA to further support program development and service delivery. The social work interns will assist in program development, referral system enhancements, and the delivery of services particularly in relation to the attendance/student engagement system and supporting students with IEPs. Additionally, the student interns will provide services including, but not limited to, individual and group counseling, crisis management, case management, school-family-community partnership coordination, teacher consultation, Graduation Seal workshops in key areas such as financial literacy, housing, finding jobs, etc., and student support team participation

**Staff Mental Health Needs:** Provide ongoing coaching, professional development, consultation, staff training, and professional development in relation to special education services, trauma-informed classroom strategies, differentiated instruction, comprehensive learning support systems, case management, and other areas as needed. ECA Administration will provide ongoing efforts to build capacity at the ECA to strengthen its student support system and will provide guided oversight for special education accountability (i.e., tracking, documentation, reporting, etc.). CAYCI staff will provide on-site coaching and support

Student Health Services: A school nurse will be on call for any problems that may occur.
